Pennard Community Hall

We have just completed another step in the decarbonisation of the Community hall as planned in our Climate and Ecological Emergency Plan thanks to a Grant from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund South West Wales and the help of the Rural Anchor Team

Last month saw the installation of 26 solar panels onto the roof of the hall, as well as a 22 Kw Electric Vehicle charger. The introduction of the Charger which will benefit the hall funds is hoped to also bring people to the village supporting local businesses as well has providing a useful facility to visitors booking into the many holiday lets in the villages.

Watch this space for further updates on lighting and insulation upgrades, all of which will support the reduction of costs and our carbon footprint.

Community Budget Consultation

Every year the Community Council sets a budget that will fund the work of the Council for the coming financial year. We want to hear where you think we should prioritise our funding for this year and planning for future years. This budget gives us the amount of money the Community Council needs to deliver for the Community; this is called the "Precept" and is one of the lines on your council tax bill. This financial year, for a Band D property the precept is £63.27 for the whole year or £5.27 a month. Households who receive Council Tax support also receive that for the Precept. As well as the basic running costs of the Community Hall, Park, Playing Fields, Burial Ground and Community Garden, the Council employs staff, organises Christmas and Summer Events including support to the annual Carnival and provides to support to households in the Community through the PEFTA Scheme (Pennard Energy Food and Technology Assistance)

We would like to understand your priorities for the coming year and beyond so we can consider these as part of our Budget setting process, the closing date for responses is 31 Dec 2025.

News From The Links (in the sky)

Pennard Golf Club have asked us to share the following with the Community:

At PGC we are very proud of the achievements of our golfers, and particularly the Juniors. Thomas Maclean won the overall Under 16 Welsh Championship and Rebecca Del-Sol Gonzalez was third in the overall and winner of the Welsh Girls under 16 Championship. These 2 also represented Wales in Under 18 International Matches during 2025 and together with Matthew Lewis are again in the Welsh Squad for 2026. 8 Juniors played in County Teams during the year.

Head PGA Sean Pearson's Golf Academy has become increasingly popular over recent years. Junior Academy levels at Bronze, Silver and Gold cater for all ages and levels of ability and help youngsters to progress to full Membership of the Golf Club. Any youngster interested in joining the Academy should contact Sean or call at the Pro shop, where they will receive a warm welcome. Beginner classes at Pennard incorporate off course and on course sessions to help young golfers reach the standard required to join the Golf Club. Currently 12 beginners regularly attend these sessions. There is also a "new to golf" programme for Ladies as well as one to one teaching lessons with one of the 3 PGA qualified professionals available to all.

There is also an indoor teaching and practice studio for players to continue to hone their game during the winter months.

- · Brings £3.2million into the local economy annually
- Employs over 30 staff, mostly from the Pennard Community
- · Raises considerable funds for Charity (£12000+ in 2025 so far)

- Manages 550+ acres of environmentally sensitive land in co-operation with a number of environmental stakeholders

Pennard Community Charity


The Pennard Community Charity was set up on 11th December 1987, to manage the land that was bequeathed to the Community of Pennard Parish. The land was sold subsequently, and the proceeds invested.

The Charity uses the income generated from the invested funds to support worthy causes for the general benefit of the inhabitants of the Community of Pennard, in one or more, of the following categories:

- 1. Support the aged, less abled and those in need.
- 2. Help with the relief of sickness and distress.
- 3. Provision and support of facilities for social welfare such as recreation and other leisure-time activities of the inhabitants, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants.
- 4. Provision and support of educational facilities.

Individuals or Organisations within the Community of Pennard Parish may apply for donations towards the charitable purposes outlined above.





Since its inception, the Charity has helped many worthy causes such as:

The purchase and maintenance of defibrillators

Providing funds for sports clubs to purchase equipment **Supporting the PEFTA scheme**

Contributions towards educational and personal development events for young persons

Contributions towards home education, such as Computers and Kitchen Aids

Support of Pennard Primary School, for items not the responsibility of the Local Council, such as, school yard games markings.



SOUTH GOWER COMMUNITY BUS

As you maybe aware, a group of local residents started the South Gower Community Bus last year. This was done with the assistance of the 4th Region, an organisation established by the Welsh Government to promote sustainable transport, and the bus service was set up as a project through the Pennard Area Community Partnership.



Over the last year, the bus committee have been working hard towards formalising its organisation in becoming a Charitable Incorporated Organisation with its own constitution and bank account.

The service has not been without it's hiccups, as there was a short break when the original bus provider closed down. It is now being provided by DANSA, a not for profit organisation that specialises in Community Bus Services. DANSA have now purchased a new bus for the service and stops have been added to the Linkside Estate.


